Thought provoking questions:

1. Think of an experience in your life you would describe as an adventure. What aspects made it an adventure? What feelings do you associate with that experience?
2. How has your faith journey been adventurous? Can you think of a time where you felt like God was inviting you into something a bit risky but you said “yes” anyway?
3. Matthew says that the rich young ruler went away “grieving” because he had much property. If he did not give up his wealth to follow Jesus, what was he grieving? The text seems to allude that he did not follow Jesus, what do you think he lost in choosing not to follow Jesus? What did he gain in choosing not to follow Jesus?
4. Luke describes Levi’s calling as immediate. Levi seems to jump in and celebrate the opportunity to give up everything and follow Jesus. Why? What do you think Levi was feeling that made Jesus’ invitation so appealing?
5. What talents do you have to offer the peacemaking adventures here at Crossroads Church? What is holding you back from committing those talents?
